The Brown County Inn has been a mainstay in scenic Brown County, Indiana since it opened in 1974. The 65,000 square foot hotel, restaurant, and bar became a gathering place for visitors and local families alike. They would enjoy playing tennis and miniature golf in the sprawling yard or swim in the large indoor/outdoor pool. Over the years, the hotel housed Indy 500 sponsors and country music celebrities. In 1975, a banquet hall, known as "Town Hall", was added and became a place for weddings, family reunions, and business meetings, as well as an annual New Year's Eve party.

The Inn is located in downtown Nashville and is just walking distance to shops and all the amenities the town of Nashville, Indiana has to offer. The quaint village of Nashville is a great place for a romantic getaway, with hundreds of unique craft, specialty & antique shops, and great music & theatre venues. Visitors enjoy watching artists in galleries and craft studios throughout Brown County Indiana.
