Executive Committee District Director

Description

The IASC High School Division Executive Committee shall consist of 6 high school level student council advisers and 12 - 18 students representing the 6 IASC Geographical Districts. These 6 advisers shall have the title of IASC HS Division District Director. The "West" Districts' Directors shall be elected in odd number years. The "East" Districts' Directors shall be elected in even number years. The term of service is 2 years; these being July 1 - June 30, the IASC fiscal year.

District Directors are essential for the delivery of IASC program. Below is a listing of expectations.

Expectations

1. To attend High School Division Executive Committee Meetings. In a typical year there are 8 meetings. These meetings occur in August, September, October (2); in November in conjunction with State Convention; in January; in March in conjunction with Representative Assembly; and in April.
2. To attend the High School Division State Convention (typically in November).
3. To attend High School Division Representative Assembly (typically in March/April).
4. To attend the High School Division Executive Committee Retreat (typically 4 - 5 days in June or July).
5. To work collaboratively as a team with the IASC Executive Director, IASC HS Division Associate Director and the other HS Division District Directors to develop and deliver the HS Division leadership curriculum and the Advisers' Conference program.
6. To work collaboratively with the HS Division Executive Committee in the development and delivery of the HS Division Regional Workshops, HS Division State Convention and HS Division Representative Assembly program.
7. To work collaboratively as a team with the Student District Representatives to deliver IASC communication and programs to member schools.
8. To communicate with advisers from member schools regarding IASC program.
9. To communicate with non-member schools in an effort to secure their membership.
10. To mentor "rookie" advisers, checking in with them frequently, and assisting them when possible.

Benefits

1. Complimentary registration to the IASC Adviser's Conference, District Workshop, State Convention & Representative Assembly.
